Outreach,
Access and
Recovery



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Many suffer from disabling mental illnesses, co-occurring substance use, trauma, and medical issues that impact their ability to work. The path to recovery can be extraordinarily challenging when one is constantly struggling to meet basic needs. Having income and health care benefits is often a critical first step on the road to recovery.

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Data from the Social Security Administration documents an initial approval rate of 39% for persons who applied for SSI or SSDI in 2021. SOAR National outcomes on initial applications using the SOAR model in 2021 have an average of 60% approval rate and 50% at the appeals stage.

SOAR Case Manager assists individuals applying for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) who

- are experiencing or at risk for homelessness
- have serious mental and/or physical illnesses that affect their ability to work

SOAR is a model developed to help those who are experiencing or at-risk for homelessness, so they don't need to fit the literal definition of homeless. At-risk for homelessness can include those who are in transitional housing, couch-surfing, exiting jails/institutions without somewhere to live, and those in permanent supportive housing who are entirely supported by grant funding.

SOAR Case Manager Functions:

- Facilitates communication among SSI/SSDI benefit applicants, case managers, Social Security Administration (SSA), Disability Determination Services (DDS), and community providers
- Assumes a central role in gathering complete, targeted, and relevant information for SSA and DDS
- Helps the disability determination process move more smoothly and quickly by providing assistance to SSA and DDS
 - Focus on documenting disability and its effect on functioning via a Medical Summary Report, reducing the need for consultative exams
- Seeks approval on initial applications, avoiding the need for appeals
